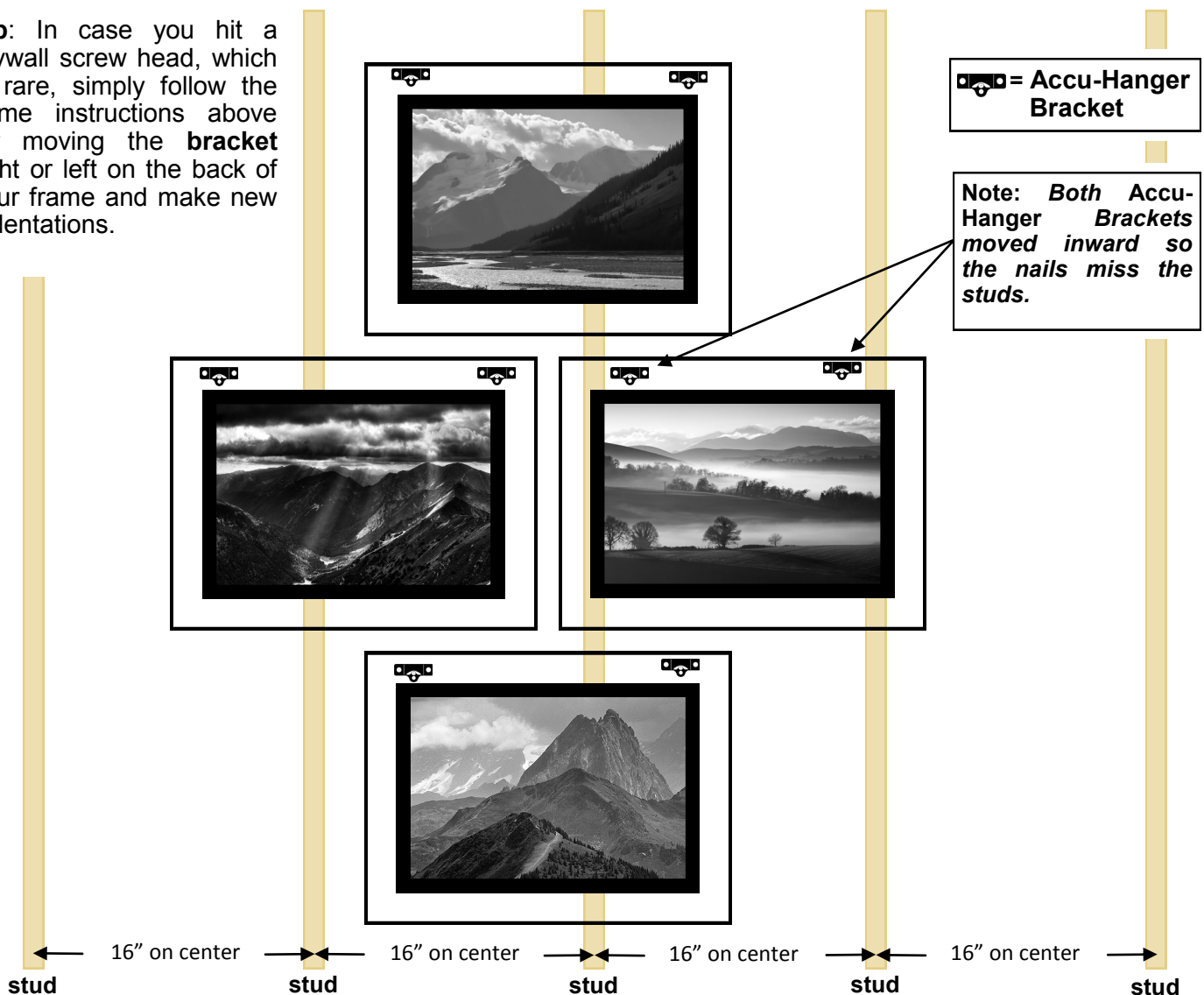

HOW TO HANG PICTURES IN A COLLAGE & AVOID STUDS

When hanging picture frames in a grouping, collage, in a row or any configuration you desire, you can hang all of your picture frames without encountering studs using the diagram shown below. This will require you to locate all of the studs behind the wall prior to hanging your picture frames using a stud finder. You can purchase one at your local hardware store. This process outlined below, will apply to picture frames that are 6" or more in width. When you encounter a stud that aligns with one of the **Accu-Hanger** brackets on the back of your picture frame, simply move the **Accu-Hanger** bracket to the right or left on the back of your frame so it avoids the stud. Your picture will still hang perfectly straight and in the location you've selected. On average, you will only encounter a stud approximately 10% to 15% of the time. You can pound the nails directly into the studs leaving the nail head sticking out approximately 1/8" from the wall. Nails that catch the edge of a stud can cause the nail to kick off to the right or left, depending on which side of the stud edge you've caught, and it can cause your picture to hang crooked. If this happens, simply move the **Accu-Hanger** bracket a minimum of 3/8" right or left on the back of your frame and make a new indentation away from the stud. If you have already removed the detachable marking device, attach a new **Accu-Hanger** bracket and make new marks. Cover existing marks on wall with masking tape before making new marks so you know which ones are the new marks.

Tip: In case you hit a drywall screw head, which is rare, simply follow the same instructions above for moving the **bracket** right or left on the back of your frame and make new indentations.
